### **COMMUNICATION BETWEEN HOME AND SCHOOL**

At the start of every year we ask families to ensure that they have their Compass login details up to date. Compass is our primary communication method and it is vital that families ensure their notifications are turned on so that they can keep up to date with important information including school events, excursions and emergency management procedures. If you have any questions about accessing Compass please contact the office. Currently all families have been asked to complete the 'General Consent', this includes photography, local excursion, ICT Acceptable Use Agreements and more. We have a large number of students who do not have permission to participate in these events as of today, which means that they will not be able to use ICT, participate in activities in the local community such as Coventry oval. Please log on to Compass and ensure that you have completed all permissions as this will ensure your child is able to fully participate in the wide range of rich learning experiences which teachers have planned to support them to thrive.

It is vital that we have clear and open communication between home and the school so that we can work in partnership to support your child. We understand that at times you may need to speak to your teacher, the best way to do this is to either send them an email or call the office to arrange a time to meet with them. Generally, teachers respond to parent emails within 2 school days. If the matter is more urgent than that e.g. a change in pick up arrangements, etc. please call the office so the message can be passed on to your child. Where possible please call before 3pm. One of the many wonderful things about DCPS is that we are a small community. A reminder that it is not appropriate to discuss school business with staff via their personal mobile numbers or outside of school hours.

### **ASSEMBLY**

Today we had our first Assembly. Our Friday Assemblies are a terrific way of celebrating our student achievements, keeping in touch with what is happening around the school and connecting as a school community. Our usual assemblies starting at 3pm and Diamond Assemblies (Week 4 and 8 of each Term) at 2:45. In the event of extreme heat, rain, etc. assemblies will be held online with a Webex link being sent on the day to families via Compass.

### **EXTREME WEATHER CONDITIONS**

With more hot weather heading our way please ensure that your child has their hat and drink bottle at school every day. We recommend that your child also applies sunscreen before school, teachers will encourage them to reapply at lunchtime. If you would like to supply your child with their own sunscreen please feel free to do so, otherwise the school has some sunscreen which students are able to use. If you do not wish your child to use the sunscreen provided by the school please inform your child's teacher.

In the event of extreme weather (heat/rain/wind/etc) students will spend a portion or all of recess/lunch inside as part of our emergency management processes.

### **BUILDING WORKS**

As you know building works are continuing around our school with a number of projects continuing throughout the term. Unfortunately, at times this may change the areas where students can play or impact the carpark area. We will keep you informed of any changes which are necessary to keep everyone safe whilst the works are completed.

Currently we are working with the VSBA to rebuild our raised deck which will become an outdoor learning area and also to repair the 'Canteen' which is part of the Historic building. We appreciate your patience and look forward to these improvements to the school buildings being completed in the coming months.

### MEDICATIONS AND MEDICAL ACTION PLANS

If your child requires medication to be administered at any time during the school year, please come up to the office to fill in the required authorisation paper work. Prescription medications need to be in their original packet with the child's name, doctor's name and prescribed dosage.

If you would like to keep antihistamines, Panadol, etc. at the school for us to administer please also come to the office to fill in the required paperwork and provide the medication in a labelled snap lock bag or container.

If your child has a medical condition such as asthma, anaphylaxis, etc. and required specific management please ask your GP to complete a medical action plan and return it to the school. If you would like a blank form to take to your appointment, please contact the office.

### RESPECTING OUR NEIGHBOURS AND THE ENVIRONMENT

Diamond Creek Primary School is very fortunate to have wonderful neighbours who help to take care of our school community. Unfortunately, we have had a number of neighbours expressing concerns around our students behaviour when they are travelling to and from school.

If your child walks or rides their bike to school, please remind them about the importance of doing so in a way which is safe for themselves and those they are sharing the roads/foot paths with.

It has also come to our attention that at times we have parents blocking driveways, or parking too close to corners, pedestrian crossings, etc. please be safe when driving and parking around the school. To assist with the lack of parking we strongly encourage families to utilise our 'kiss and drop' zone. A reminder that this line should be moving at all times with the students only coming through the gate when your car is the first in line and stationery. If your child is walking to and from school please remind them where it is safe to cross the road and how to walk safely on the paths.

We are also aware that there is a large amount of litter in the area surrounding our school. Please speak to your children about the importance of using bins to dispose of their rubbish responsibly. We are very lucky to have wonderful neighbours and live in a beautiful environment. Hopefully we can all work together to look after our local area, including the local animals. I am sure many children came home very excited yesterday after we had a kangaroo visit us for the day taking shade under a shade of a tree. How fortunate we are to live, work and play in an area surrounded by beautiful natural environment.

- Informing the Behaviour Matrix which is included in this newsletter and has been implemented across the school.
- Providing additional supervision and support for students during recess and lunchtime.
- Improvements to our Wellbeing program across the school.

In the coming weeks we will be sending out a survey regarding the way we communicate with families. We look forward to using this information to guide future improvements.



## Literacy Instruction at Diamond Creek Primary School

Hello families.

There has been a lot of coverage in the media about literacy instruction in Victorian schools recently. From this year, all Victorian schools are required to teach systematic synthetic phonics from years Foundation – Grade 2, with at least 25 minutes of explicit instruction in phonemic awareness and phonics.

At Diamond Creek Primary School, we have followed this approach for many years and our Literacy program follows a structured and evidence based approach that focuses on building students' speaking, listening, reading, writing and thinking skills. In the initial stages of reading instruction, students are encouraged to use their knowledge of letter-sound relationships to work out words. Students are taught sounds in a sequence, so letters that build many words (such as s, a, t, p, i, n) are taught first.

As your child starts learning sounds, they will bring home - and use in class - books that utilise the sounds they know. These are called decodable readers. Decodable readers have stories that use words made up of the letters your child has learnt. They will be able to work out new words from the letters and sounds they know, rather than guessing.

As students become capable decoders, we continue to build and develop skills in the 'Big Six' of reading instruction - oral language, phonological awareness, phonics, vocabulary, fluency and comprehension. In our spelling program, students are taught rules to apply when reading and spelling words. Spelling sessions also explore the units of meaning within words such as prefixes, roots and suffixes. Through word study and etymology (the history of words) students learn about how meaning influences the way words are spelled.

In Writing, students are taught the 'building blocks' of good writing – ideas, organisation, voice, sentence fluency, word choice, conventions and presentation. Students are engaged in all parts of the writing process, including planning, drafting, editing and publishing. Students also explore the systems and structures of language through explicit instruction in grammar and syntax.

Speaking and Listening is embedded across all areas of the curriculum. Effective communication in both expressive and receptive language are essential skills for all students and fundamental in the acquisition of literacy skills. Students develop these skills through formal and informal classroom activities, including Reader's Theatre, presentations and role plays.

Students from Foundation to Grade 4 also have access to the multi-award winning platform Nessy. Nessy has been rigorously developed and tested by literacy experts, educators and speech pathologists to ensure that all aspects of the program provide explicit and targeted activities that students enjoy.

Diamond Creek Primary School is committed to using evidence based practice. The 'science of learning' is well established and our literacy instruction reflects this; it follows a rigorous, predictable and research informed structure based on the most current information around how children best learn.

### School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS)

We are excited to be involved in developing and implementing School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support at Diamond Creek Primary School, an evidence-based framework recognised as best practice by the Victorian Department of Education.

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) is a framework that brings together school communities to develop positive, safe and supportive learning cultures. SWPBS will assist schools to improve the social, emotional, behavioural and academic outcomes for children and young people.

- Through the implementation of SWPBS, teachers and students will have more time to focus on building strong relationships and classroom instruction. Staff and students will benefit from;
  - Increased respectful behaviour and positive behaviour
  - Increased time focused on instruction
  - Improved social-emotional wellbeing
  - Positive and respectful relationships among staff and students
  - A predictable learning environment with improved perceptions of safety and increased attendance.

Over the course of the last 12 months, the staff at Diamond Creek have been working hard to develop a mission statement and the SWPBS Behaviour matrix.

Our behaviour matrix is now on display in every classroom around the school. The matrix translates Diamond Creek's school values of **Respect, Cooperation, Persistence and Striving for Excellence** into expected behaviours within our school community.

This not only establishes a common approach and language to behaviour expectations but also allows for expected behaviours to be explicitly taught in every classroom and every setting.

### How Can Parents/Carers Support SWPBS?

We believe that parental involvement is crucial to the success of SWPBS. Here are some ways you can get involved:

- Familiarise Yourself: Take some time to learn about SWPBS and its core components, so you can
  reinforce these positive behaviours at home. We will continue to share information about SWPBS to the
  wider school community through our newsletter and website.
- Supportive Communication: Maintain open and positive communication with your child's teachers and school staff to ensure a coordinated effort in promoting positive behaviour.
- Encourage at Home: Reinforce the importance of positive behaviour, respect, and responsibility in your child's daily life.

We are excited about the positive changes SWPBS can bring to our school community, and we look forward to working together to create a nurturing and supportive environment where every child can thrive.


